The SBU Bearcats return home Saturday to host the Kentucky Wesleyan Panthers. Both teams will be looking for their first win of the season in what is SBU's first day game of the season. SBU is coming off a loss at FCS Southern Illinois while Kentucky Wesleyan is coming off a narrow loss at Kentucky State.

Junior quarterback **Steve Gachette** continues his record-setting career for the Bearcats. Already this season, he's set single game school records for total offense (573 yards) and passing yards (459) as well as career marks for passing attempts (1198) and total offense (8672) which added to the ten individual marks he held coming into the year. He became the only player in SBU history to throw for more than 400 yards and rush for more than 100 in a single game against Harding. Gachette ranks second in the nation in total offense (378 yds/game) and second in the nation in passing yards (1275).

WR **Johnnie King**, who led the nation in receptions per game (89 grabs in 10 games) in 2008, is tied for 34th nationally in receiving yards per game (90). SBU ranks 22nd nationally in Division II in total offense (447 ypg) and ninth in passing offense (319 ypg). Sophomore **Charles Johnson** has stepped his game up recently, with back-to-back career highs in receptions (eight at Harding and ten at Southern Illinois).

LB **Jarred Schumpert** leads D-II in tackles per game 13.25. Schumpert has led or tied for the team lead in tackles in his three previous seasons with SBU. Schumpert is also tied for 10th with 2.13 tackles for loss per game.

THE COACHES AND THE ALL-TIME SERIES

Bearcat head coach **Keith Allen** is in his third season at the helm of the Bearcats. He's already engineered a significant turnaround, moving the 'Cats from 0-11 his first year as interim coach, to 5-6 in 2008, when SBU was three plays away from a potential 8-3 mark.

Panther coach **Brent Holsclaw** is 10-35 in his seventh season with Kentucky Wesleyan. (The mark does not include 21 games (5-16) vacated by the NCAA.) SBU leads the all-time series 4-0 after winning 34-14 last year in Owensboro.

SCOUTING THE PANTHERS

The Panthers have struggled out of the gate, falling in their first three road games including a loss to FCS Murray State. **Thomas Gordon** leads the Panther attack offensively and was the GLFC Player of the Week after rushing for 229 yards on 22 carries and three scores. He ranks 11th in Division II in rushing (119.7 ypg) while the Panther offense ranks 32nd in rushing yards (188 ypg). KWC's **David James** is tied for 33rd nationally in tackles (9.7 per game).



GOING DEEP

STARTING OFF RIGHT

In last season's game with the KWC Panthers, SBU moved quickly, scoring first with 11:31 left in the first quarter. KWC fumbled the ensuing kickoff and SBU converted that into a quick TD pass. Just three and a half minutes had elapsed and SBU led 14-0. SBU led at halftime 34-0 and left with a 34-14 victory.

TYRIN TO THE HOUSE (ALMOST)

2008 SBU Defensive Newcomer of the Year **Tyrin Holt** intercepted a NWMSU pass in the third quarter and returned it 63 yards to the two-yard line. Holt's return was the longest interception return for SBU since Jamaal Keyton's 77-yard pick six against Pitt State in 2003.

HOME SWEET HOME

Last season at home, the Bearcats averaged 527 yards in total offense in six games with the high (667 yards) coming in the blow out win over Bethany. The rush high also came against the Swedes (273) while the passing high (426) was in the homecoming win over Grand View. In one game at Plaster so far in 2009, NWMSU held the Bearcats to 327 yards in total offense.

HOT READ

NOT MANY RECORDS LEFT

Junior QB **Steve Gachette** continues rake in the records, with SBU marks for single game total offense and passing vs. Harding, total offense in the game with NWMSU and career attempts vs. UCM. He entered 2009, already holding SBU records for most touchdown passes (6), passing attempts (68) and passing completions (45) in a game. He also holds SBU records for most passing attempts (515), passing completions (315) and passing yards (3360), touchdown passes (27) in a season. He holds SBU career records for passing completions (634), passing yards (6652), and touchdown passes (44).

HARDING HIGH SCORES

September 12th's thriller at Harding was typical of the series with the last four meetings between Harding and SBU ending with the winner scoring more than 40 points. In 2006 in Bolivar, the Bisons won 43-30. 2007 saw the Bisons slip by with a 43-40 in Searcy. Last year SBU came out on top, winning 43-31 in Bolivar.

TOTAL PLAY

Through their first four games, the SBU Bearcats have been consistent with the number of total offense plays during the game. Against UCM and NWMSU, the 'Cats ran 75 plays. It jumped to 89 in the three-overtime loss at Harding but was 77 in regulation. At SIU the Bearcats ran 76 offensive plays.

LONG TIME COMING

The marathon three-overtime contest at Harding was a new high for SBU in length of game at four hours and 27 minutes. The previous mark was in 2007 in Bolivar versus Truman State in a game that lasted four hours and six minutes. Truman won that contest 55-31.

LAST GAME FOR THE SBU BEARCATS

SBU football falls at Southern Illinois

CARBONDALE, Ill. -- The SBU Bearcats started fast, scoring on their first drive, but after that it was all Southern Illinois, as the Salukis scored the next 59 points to win 59-7.

An 18-yard pass from **Steve Gachette** to **Charles Johnson** put the Bearcats on top early, capping a nine play, 78-yard drive that lasted just 80 seconds. Division I FCS member Southern Illinois (1-1) answered right back, when **Deji Karim** returned the kickoff 82 yards for a touchdown. SIU's **Kyle Dougherty** would add a field goal at the 7:51 mark and SIU quarterback **Chris Dieker** would hit **Joe Allaria** for a 77-yard scoring strike and SIU led 17-7 after the first quarter of action.

The Salukis would add three scores in the second quarter and led at halftime 38-7. SIU got the only touchdown in the third quarter on a 61-yard touchdown run by Karim. SIU got an early fourth quarter touchdown from **Lucien Walker** to lead 52-7 and added another in the fourth to win 59-7.

"Our kids came out and competed, but SIU is a much deeper and stronger team," said head coach **Keith Allen**. "Offensively we moved the ball well in the first quarter, but our mistakes stopped us. Though we improved on turnovers and penalties from a week ago, we can still do a better job. The offensive line held their own, but we were disappointed in the defensive effort. You could really see the caliber of athletes they have with 63 scholarships. Their depth was a real factor."

Gachette led the Bearcats, going 26 of 47 for 210 yards. Gachette was sacked four times and threw three interceptions. Johnson led the 'Cat receivers with 10 catches for 102 yards. Gachette was also the leading SBU rusher with 63 yards on 15 carries. **Jarred Schumpert** led the defense with nine combined tackles and one fumble recovery.

Karim rushed ten times for 210 yards and two scores for SIU. Dieker was 14 of 17 for 243 yards and two TD passes. SBU was outgained in total offense 699 to 317.



NEXT UP FOR THE SBU BEARCATS



It's back on the road next weekend for the Bearcats as they travel to Edmond, Okla., to battle the Central Oklahoma Bronchos. UCO leads the all-time series 2-0 after winning last year's shootout in Bolivar 43-40. Head coach **Tracy Holland** is in his second with the Bronchos after leading the team to a 7-4 mark in 2008. The Bronchos are members of the Lone Star Conference and compete in the North Division. **Jason Palmer** is the top rusher for the Bronchos with 354 yards on 70 carries. **Brandon Noohi** is the top passer, completing 89 of 154 throws for 853 yards and four touchdowns.

LAST YEAR VERSUS THE PANTHERS

Bearcat football wins three in a row

OWENSBORO, Ky. – The SBU Bearcats won their third game in a row for the first time since 2001, by defeating Kentucky Wesleyan, 34-14.

It is the first time that SBU has been over the .500 mark since winning the 2003 season opener to go 1-0, also against Kentucky Wesleyan in Owensboro.

The Bearcats ran 99 offensive plays and generated 524 yards of offense. They were led by **Steve Gachette**, who was 27 of 53 for three touchdowns. Gachette also scampered for 91 yards on the ground. **DeAndre Brown** and **Jeff Finnell** ran for 70 yards each.

The Bearcat defense gave up only four net yards on the ground on 28 opposing rushes. **Clint Carroz** was credited with three sacks.

"It feels good to be 3-2 right now," said SBU head coach **Keith Allen**. "We came out in the first half and executed well, on both sides of the ball. We moved the ball down the field like we wanted, and we shut them down defensively. But we were sloppy at the end of the first half with penalties, which we will address by the next game. That sloppiness carried over into the second half, especially on the offensive side of the ball. The bottom line tonight is that we made way too many errors as a team to be happy with this win."

The first half belonged to the Bearcats, on both sides of the ball. Besides holding the Panthers scoreless, the Bearcats put five touchdowns on the board.

Gachette marched SBU down the field in the first three minutes, 30 seconds of the game for the Bearcats' first touchdown, which ended with the purple quarterback running nine yards into the end zone. Kentucky Wesleyan fumbled the ensuing kickoff, and Gachette was able to find **Johnnie King** for a 13-yard touchdown on the very next play.

SBU's Jeff Finnell ran the ball in from two yards out at the 1:01 point of the first quarter to give SBU a 21-0 lead. Six minutes later, with 10 minutes remaining in the half, Gachette disappointed the Panthers' homecoming crowd with a 39-yard touchdown strike to **Jonathan Alvarado** (below), putting the Bearcats up by four touchdowns.



With seconds remaining in the half, Gachette stayed in the pocket and threw a missile to **Thaddeus Sanders** for a half-ending, 44-yard touchdown. SBU missed the extra point, but went to the locker room with a 34-0 lead.

The teams were scoreless in the third, until Gachette was picked off with a minute left in the third quarter. Wesleyan's **Robert Glover** made the interception, and ran the ball back for a 31-yard touchdown. During the third quarter, SBU's defense came up big, unleashing a triad of sacks, hard hits, and hurries on the opposing committee of quarterbacks.

Wesleyan tacked on another touchdown early in the fourth quarter to complete the scoring.
